NHL Commissioner, Gary Bettman cracks joke accepting Sports Executive of the Year Award

NEW YORK, NY (May 22, 2014) – You may not see Gary Bettman's comedic side often, but during last night's 2014 Sports Business Awards we caught a glimpse of it. During Bettman's Sports Executive of the Year acceptance speech he light-heartedly joked with the crowd, "It's almost an out of body experience because this time of year I'm normally presenting a trophy and getting booed. To receive one and get applause is really quite novel."

Bettman won his first Sports Executive of the Year award at the 2014 Sports Business Awards that took place last night at the Marriott Marquis in Manhattan. The NHL and it's commissioner were the big winners taking home three awards including Sports League of the Year, Sports Event of the Year and Sports Executive of the Year. Hosted by SportsBusiness Journal and SportsBusiness Daily, the awards honoured excellence in the sports business from March 1, 2013 to Feb. 28, 2014.

Bettman beat out several other well-known candidates including Fox Sports President and COO Randy Freer, Major League Soccer Commissioner Don Garber, Under Armour CEO and founder Kevin Plank, and Sacramento Kings owner Vivek Ranadive.

The NHL won Sports Event of the Year for the 2014 Winter Classic at the University of Michigan's Big House setting a record high attendance of 105,491. The league previously won this award for the 2009 Winter Classic that was held in Buffalo, NY. As well, for the second time the NHL took home Sports League of the Year which the league previously won in 2011.

All jokes aside, in his acceptance speech Bettman made it clear that the award he received was a team effort between him and his many coworkers. Referring to how Bettman's wife described him, he was grateful for not only his day job but cited it as a lifestyle. Bettman gave thanks collectively on behalf of the league and the great game of hockey as a whole. "We have a great game, that's almost 100 years old.
